A Red-Letter day with XYZ




On 4th November, the first piece of equipment was installed in our new factory unit, with our existing machinery due to join it starting from December 17th.

Supplied, installed and commissioned by XYZ Machine Tools, the LR VMC mill is the largest of their new linear-rail series, with high-speed spindle, a choice of over 24 tools and an impressive 1060cm x 500cm table capable of providing tools for both the smallest and largest seals. gaskets and mouldings - and tool room manager Russell Willis has already started running tests and prepping new jobs for production. In fact, we were able

to film it in action for our new Ultra-small mouldings video.

The LR1000 is capable of working on multiple tools that can be fixed to the linear table and programs for each tool loaded into the system, it can then be left to its own devices like a regular DP Seals team member.

The main toolroom will remain in its current location but will expand into the area vacated by the presses, with this space also being used to optimise workflow for our cleaning and despatch processes.
